

We know some residents get confused by the different organisations that provide services in this district. Tandridge District Council, Surrey County Council, 22 parishes and Surrey Police and Crime Commissioner are responsible for various services in the area and we work together wherever we can to deliver these more efficiently.

The District Council collects the council tax on behalf of all the organisations. Each organisation is responsible for its own areas of activity, costs and spending requirements.

Of the £63.2 million Tandridge will collect during 2016/2017, it will be shared out as follows:

- Tandridge District Council £7.3 million, which is £3.82 a week for the average household*.

- Surrey County Council £46.9 million, which is £24.39 a week for the average household.*
- Surrey Police and Crime Commissioner £8.1 million, which is £4.23 a week for the average household.*
- Parish councils £0.8 million, which is 41p a week for the average household.*
